41 Lothbury, City of London. A neo-classical banking hall has been retained as the reception for seven floors of modern office space above.



2 London Bridge, City of London. GMW provided architectural and interior design for this new headquarters for private bank Ansbacher. A grade II listed Victorian building and its undistinguished nineteenth sixties' extension have been transformed to provide 4,850 sq.m. of modern offices in specific response to the bank's requirements.

Urban Design Framework, Ilford. GMW were commissioned by the London Borough of Redbridge to prepare a framework for the development of Ilford town centre over the next 25 years. The work forms part of a regeneration plan for the area.

Armada Centre, Ankara was named Europe's Best Shopping Mall in the new centres under 35,000 sq.m. category by the International Council of Shopping Centres. GMW's office worked with the concept architects, A-Tasarm, to provide full architectural design consultancy services.

Cerruti Hotel, Istanbul. The new hotel occupies a prominent site overlooking the Bosphorus. Ground and first floors provide the main public facilities and above there are four floors of hotel rooms and suites. Suites are located at the acutely angled corner of the building on all four levels, providing the opportunity to give the building a special emphasis at this point.

KLMF Architects



"f-zein", Athens. The design of the "f-zein" offices included the exterior renovation and interior refurbishment of an old industrial building. This formed the basis of an interesting working environment with flexible, almost liquid spaces, that can continually be transformed and reordered. Klmf architects emphasised a fresh and experimental design with the use of special and unusual materials.

Cleverbank, Athens. In the new offices of Cleverbank, a public relations company, Klmf architects have made the concept of a think tank into reality. The design works through a blue theme and with light, transparent surfaces – that allow or obscure views of the working spaces – so that the space relates to an actual water tank.



Apartments, Agrinio. In this 10,000 sq.m. residential project located in the suburbs of Agrinio, we emphasised the creation of special residences avoiding the usual typology of greek apartment blocks. Seven different buildings of modern design are arranged around a large common garden and many protected open-air spaces.

Mixed-use development in Krakow. The development, combining 130,000 sq.m. of retail, multiplex cinema, offices, multi-level parking and located in the city centre of Krakow next to the main railway station, is currently at Building Permit stage.

Called **"New Town - Galeria Krakowska"**, this is a major redevelopment of part of the city centre incorporating new road network, road and fast tram tunnel under the railway track and whole new infrastructure. Clients for the project are ECE Project Management and Tishman Speyer Properties

Belvedere College Science & Technology Building, Dublin. Designed around an atrium, this 1,917 sq.m. development incorporates the main entrance to the school, reception and box office, open multi-functional area, computing facilities, lecture theatre, physics, chemistry and biology laboratories, an outdoor experimental area and a greenhouse, facilitating botany and biology experimentation.



Trinity Hall Residential Development, Dublin. Three buildings arranged around collegiate quadrangles providing, in total, some 25,000 sq.m. of residential accommodation.

IOTA, Saclay. This new 20 000 sq.m. facility for the French Advanced Optics Research Centre is being constructed in the heart of the future European Scientific Pole just south of greater Paris. It includes an Engineering School and a research laboratory department, as well as a library, conference centre and cafeteria.

Mesnuls. Built during the Renaissance, enlarged and remodelled in the Classic period, the Château des Mesnuls with its mews and park is a Registered National Landmark. It has been thoroughly refurbished and fitted out to form a management training centre and executive reception suites for Thales. The park has also been restored to its former grandeur.


Parking House. Facilities for 650 cars in Copenhagen Harbour.

British Gas Headquarters, Stockley Park, London. The client requested offices of a uniform plan, consistent across, and between each of four floors. There was to be no hierarchy between departments or employee grades. Fixed rooms are interchangeable as offices or conference rooms.



Tomislav Cop Architects



Landmark Tower/U2 Studio. This is an entry for the International architectural competition for mixed use tower in the Dublin Docklands. The building comprises basement parking, a restaurant, bar and club building, and the main tower comprising, offices, flats and a recording studio in a capsule at the top of the building.



The High Club Bar at the Cacharel/Kenzo Boutique in Zagreb. In this flagship retail development, the fashion outlets are complemented by a restaurant bar.



Hotel Ilirija. The project involves the staged refurbishment of Hotel Ilirija up to 4 stars. The hotel is located on the edge of the Adriatic sea and is themed as a contemporary interpretation of local materials, and colours found in this part of Croatia.

DuPont offices, Asturias. The new headquarters building won Client Design Award for project quality and delivery.

Polaris World, La Torre Golf Resort, Murcia, Spain. Includes 5-star hotel accommodation, apartments, restaurants and golf-course facilities.



AMA Albera Monti & Associati



Villa Moebius. A country house in the hilly region of the Appennino Piacentino. Inspired by the Moebius ring, its fluid shape is a statement of modernity. The building will be energy self-sufficient with an 'intelligent' aluminium and glass cladding furnished with photovoltaic cells.

Suburbs e Colour. A Job Café in a run-down area on the outskirts of Milan, commissioned by the Municipality and Provincial Government and funded by the European Social Fund. Designed to be open and dynamic, and to become a reference point in the life of a 'difficult' neighbourhood.



AIFI offices. New offices for the Italian Association of Private Equity & Venture Capital. Solid tradition and powerful modernity are mirrored in the design of the interiors to create an environment based upon transparency, simplicity and coherence, blending thoroughly contemporary furniture with ornate 19th century stucco and decor.
